Poverty in the Former Yugoslav Countries: the Case of Bosnia and Herzegovina in 2006.

The study objectives are to identify the main characteristics of poverty among households in Bosnia and Herzegovina, according to national and regional levels. compared to other former Yugoslav countries; to determine the levels and differentials of poverty within the country; and to examine the current poverty situation compared to the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

The study depends on: Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey for Bosnia and Herzegovina (MICS 2006), Multiple Indicators Cluster Survey for Serbia (MICS 2005), Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey for Republic of Macedonia (MICS 2005), Multiple Indicators Cluster Survey For Albania (MICS 2005).

The Study applies both Descriptive and Multivariate Techniques through Logistic Regression Analysis.
