The Impact of Poverty on Women and Child Health in Yemen, Evidence from Recent YEDH and YMIC Survey.

- Examining the impact of poverty on women and child health as well as its contribution on some socio-economic variables (education, place of residence, housing conditions etc...), demographic and environmental factors in Yemen.

The Specific objectives of this research are outlined as follows:

- Studying the levels and trends of women and children health care services utilization
- Assessing the most prominent differentials in poverty and women and children health in Yemen based on the available date.
- Examining the determinants of the most important variables affecting women and children health.
- Identification the links between poverty and health of mothers and children.
- Measuring the impact of poverty on each of the relevant women and children health indicators.

The main sources of data are the Demographic and Health Survey undertaken in Yemen in 2003 and the Multiple Indicators Cluster Survey undertaken in 2006 (MICs).

Both descriptive and multivariate approaches were used in this research.
