The Status of Youth (15-29) in Egypt with Special Reference to their Education and Participation in Labor Force, 2009. (309).

The general goal of this study is to examine the status of youth population aged (15-29) years with more focus on their education and participation in the labor force in Egypt.

The study meets the following specific objectives:

- To examine the demographic and social characteristics and living conditions among youth people (15-29).
- To investigate the educational status among youth people (15-29) and its trends in Egypt.
- To examine the levels, patterns and structure of youth participation in labor force.
- To identify the demographic and socio-economic determinants of education and labor force participation among youth.

The study used the data derived from “Survey of Young People in Egypt 2009” (SYPE), which was conducted by the Egyptian cabinet – Information and Decision Support Center (IDSC) and The Population Council. The data pertaining to youth of the recent censuses are utilized also in the study.

The study follows both descriptive and analytical approaches to examine youth education and their participation in the labor force.
